POSITION SUMMARY: The Vicar is the senior associate pastor of St. Stephen's Anglican Church, reporting to the Rector and serving as a strategic ministry partner and a pastoral leader of the parish. With an executive role in leadership, planning, and execution, the Vicar assists the Rector in strategic implementation of the church's calling and mission assuring that all ministry and operational areas are working toward their fulfillment. In doing so, the Vicar will support our desire to work with excellence for the glory of God and the good of his people. In the absence of the Rector, the Vicar assumes management of the day-to-day ministries of the parish, acting and speaking on behalf of the Rector.

SPECIFIC MINISTRY AREAS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

FORMATION MINISTRIES: The Vicar guides the staff, lay ministers, and programmatic aspects of St. Stephen's formation ministries, consisting of Children's, Student, and Adult formation as well as Community Life. In addition to the on-going work of formation by these ministries, we have a longer-term goal of developing a discipleship pathway from nursery through adulthood. The Director of Community Life is a new position for St. Stephen's tasked with developing a strong sense of community through large events and small groups. Direct staff reports to the Vicar from this area include: the Minister to Children and Families, Minister to Students and Families, and Director of Community Life.

MISSION: St. Stephen's is deepening our sense of call to Christian mission on two fronts: individual and corporate. Individually, we want to instill the value that every follower of Jesus is a minister called and gifted for mission and that our mission encompasses every aspect of our life. The Vicar will cultivate this as we integrate an understanding of spiritual gifts as well as the call to use those gifts in every sphere of life: work, school, home, etc. into our formation ministries at all age levels. Corporately, we are revisioning our relationship with individual and institutional mission partners through the work of our Mission Commission. We want to narrow the number of our partners in order to deepen our level of involvement in their ministries. The Vicar will continue this work, guiding the work of the Commisson and others to help us raise the visibility of our mission partners and provide opportunities to join them in their ministries.

PARTNER MINISTRIES: The Vicar will also oversee partner ministeries and associated operations in the church. St. Stephen's has two important partner ministries: St. Stephen's Mother's Morning Out and Noah Ark Preschool is a long-standing anchor of our community with a 40 year track record of excellence in early childhood education. It currently has around 100 students and 22 full-time and part-time teachers. The Vicar will serve as supervisor to the Director of MMO/NA. Our other partner ministry is the Pittsburgh Fellows. The Pittsburgh Fellows graduated its first class in 2006. The emphasis of the PF is primarily on developing missional leaders for the business world. The Fellows program has been very important to St. Stephen's, providing a strong pipeline of young adults into the congregation who have a deep sense of purpose and mission in the kingdom. The Vicar will work closely with the Executive Director and serve on the Fellows Board.

CLERGY RESPONSIBILITIES: As a presbyter of St. Stephen's, the Vicar will provide worship leadership on Sundays. They will also be a member of the Pastoral team, providing pastoral care to the congregation, rotating on the weekend pastoral on-call line, and officiating at weddings and funerals as needed. The Vicar will be on the preaching rotation, normally preaching at weekend services once a month. The Vicar (along with other clergy) attends monthly Vestry meetings in a non-voting capacity to help align the work of that body with the work of the ministry staff.


- A growing relationship with Jesus Christ that is evidenced by the fruit of the Spirit.

ABOUT ST. STEPHEN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH

St. Stephen's was founded in 1863 and has been a fixture in the village of Sewickley, the northern suburbs of Pittsburgh, and the Diocese of Pittsburgh ever since. Over the past 50 years, St. Stephen's has been been known as a parish grounded in strong biblical preaching and teaching from the pulpit as well as in our formation ministries. We have three Sunday services. The 8 a.m. service is a traditional service without music lasting around 50 minutes. The 9:15 a.m. service is traditional with hymns and choir. The 11:15 a.m. is casual with modern settings of hymns and contemporary music. We currently have around 500 people in worship and Children's Ministry on Sunday morning.
